Anticipated Outcome

Teachers will increase their intentional use of the curriculum materials - including interventions and routines. We will also see an increase of student performance on HMH/iReady unit assessments.

Monitoring/Evaluation

Teams will utilize HMH reports (standards, class, diagnostic, selection tests, unit assessments) and iReady reports (personalized pathway minutes/scores, comprehension checks, unit assessments) to gauge progress. Administrators will conduct walkthroughs for each cycle - using a rubric specifically looking at curriculum use, student engagement, routines, and pacing. This information will be tallied and reviewed throughout the year. Teachers will engage in debriefing sessions after each walkthrough to discuss their success and challenges.
