- 4. We will offer workshops, programs, parent conferences, open house, Title I meetings, and activities throughout the school year at a variety of times.
- 5. We will encourage <u>all of our parents</u> to take part in what our school has to offer. The school will provide opportunities for regular meetings to formulate ideas and suggestions, and to have parents participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any suggestions in a practical and timely manner.
