Welcome to EPS Cyber Choice Academy at Emerson-Gridley

We are so excited that you have chosen to be a part of our Cyber Choice Academy! We are here to help you have a successful school year. Please use this guide to help you navigate the K-12 Stride online learning platform. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your teacher or any member of the administration.

Trial Period /Academic Support Plan (ASP)

Our mission at Erie's Public Schools is to create a personalized pathway of success for each student. To ensure that all Cyber Choice Academy students are enrolled in the learning environment that best meets their needs, we have a three-week trial period. If you meet the required weekly hour and progress standards during the trial period, you will be invited to continue with us here at the Cyber Choice Academy. Students who do not meet the weekly hour and progress standards (hours and activities) during the trial period will be enrolled at their home school.

If at any time you fall behind in your course work and are failing, you will be required to come into the lab at Emerson-Gridley daily and will be placed on an academic support plan.

The academic support plan is an intense 15 consecutive day plan to help get you back on track with course work. If you do not follow the academic support plan or do not come into the building, you will automatically be enrolled at your home school. At the end of the 15 consecutive day ASP, our team will review your progress to determine if you need additional time in our lab, may work continue to work from home, or might need to return to a more traditional building for support.

IN-PERSON LABS

You are welcome to visit our labs and work with our certified teachers anytime you feel you need in-person support. All students entering our lab will need a photo identification card. You must have **a picture ID on our Infinite Campus program**. We can have one made for you if you do not have one. It is required to enter the building lab sessions.

Our Cyber Labs are on Emerson-Gridley's top floor. We offer two sessions each day: the morning session, from 8-10:50 a.m. and the afternoon session, from 12-3 p.m. Students who attend the morning lab are invited to attend lunch in the cafeteria from 10:50-11:20 a.m. before exiting the building. Students who attend Emerson-Gridley's afternoon lab may arrive at 11:30 a.m. to eat lunch beforehand if they desire. Our high school program operates on an A/B day schedule. Both our in-person labs and Class Connects sessions follow the A/B schedule. Core classes (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies) are scheduled on alternating A/B days. Elective courses are scheduled every day of school.

When attending a lab session, whether morning or afternoon, students are expected to report to school on time and remain for the **entire session**. When students come to the lab, they will receive direct instruction of the daily lesson from their teachers. When students are not in the lab, they must log in daily at the indicated time to required Class Connect sessions. At the Class Connect sessions, they will receive direct instruction of the daily lesson from their teachers.

The Cyber Choice Academy reserves the right to require lab attendance for students who have fallen behind or have not routinely been achieving their attendance requirements. In other words:

- 1. If you have not met your attendance requirements or course activity requirements for three consecutive weeks, you will be placed on an academic support plan- requiring your attendance in the lab.
- 2. If you fail to keep pace in your courses, we may similarly require you to attend in-person labs to work with a teacher to get caught up.

Lab sessions give you the opportunity to learn and work in a quiet environment where you have access to teachers in real time. You can get help with quizzes, tests, and comprehensive exams, get mini-lessons on information you're struggling with, or just get help navigating through some tricky concepts.

NOTE: Attending in person lab and/or required Class Connect sessions does not automatically fulfill your daily attendance and progress requirements. You must complete your daily assignments and plan, which should take you at least 5 hours per day of online work.



Attendance Requirements

- 1. As part of the Erie's Public Schools school district, the Cyber Choice Academy follows the EPS school year calendar.
- 2. Students MUST log in to their K-12 Stride account each day school is in session in our district.
- 3. K-12 Stride sets a "Plan" for each student. Students must complete their "Daily Plan" for each school day or will be marked absent.
- 4. Students must complete all parts of the lesson, both what is online and workbooks. This should take at least 5 hours.

Submitting Excuses for Student Absences

School attendance is important and directly affects student success. Whenever possible, please try to schedule doctor's appointments and other commitments outside of school hours. If your child is absent from school, please send an excuse in one of the following ways:

- 1. Drop off a written note or doctor's excuse, including student's name, date of absence and reason for absence, in person at Emerson-Gridley (816 Park Avenue North).
- 2. Send an email to our Attendance Office at <u>EGattendance@eriesd.org</u>, that includes the information listed above.

Materials

Erie's Public Schools provides all students with a District-owned Chromebook. If you are new to the district or do not have a Chromebook from your previous school, you may visit the main office at Emerson-Gridley and pick up a Chromebook. If you already own a computer or laptop of your own and do not want the responsibility of having a District-owned Chromebook, you are free to access Edgenuity through your own computer. Chromebooks that are not working can be switched out in the office for a new one, which may require a small fee.

Students who come into the lab must bring their charged district chrome book and their charger.

State Assessments

All cyber students are required to take the PA Keystone Exams.

Credit Breakdown

To receive full credit for a class, you must complete the required coursework with a D or above. Just as you need to earn 26 credits to graduate high school, you must also complete a prescribed number of credits to be categorized as having attained a certain grade level.

Here's the breakdown of credits you need to earn in each grade to be eligible to move on to the next grade:

Grade	Credits
9th	0 - 6.0
10th	6.5 - 12.0
11th	12.5 - 18.0
12th	18.5 - 26

And here's a breakdown of credits by subject area you need to earn while you are in high school:

Subject	Number of credits
English	4.0
Math	4.0
Science	4.0
Social Studies	4.0 (.5 credit must be Government)
Physical Education	1.5
Electives	8.5
Total needed	26

Pathways to Graduation

For graduating students, Pennsylvania's law, Act 158, requires students to show that they are aware of what happens after graduation and that they are ready for life after high school. Over the past few years, the state has asked schools to help graduating seniors demonstrate that they're ready for a career or for more education once they graduate. Things like the Keystone Exams and Career Readiness Portfolios are examples of activities which come to you from these laws. There are 5 pathways, outlined by the state, that lead to graduation.

Pathway 1 (Keystone Proficiency) –The first Pathway is through the Keystone Exams. Yes, the Keystones need to be taken no matter what, but now you don't have to worry as much about passing them. Pennsylvania has removed the requirement that says students MUST pass the Keystones. However, taking - and passing - the Keystones is the simplest way of meeting the new PA Graduation Requirements. Showing proficiency on all three Keystone Exams successfully completes one pathway to graduation.

Pathway 2 (Composite Pathway)- If the Keystones have been taken, but a student has not scored proficient in all three core subjects, Pennsylvania now offers a **Composite Pathway** to graduation. The Composite Pathway simply says that a student needs to score "Proficient" or "Advanced" on at least ONE (1) Keystone Exam. Have no "Below Basic" scores. Total scores from all three exams must be 4452 or higher. This is the second simplest pathway.

The remaining three pathways all start with passing the Algebra, Literature, and Biology requirements for Erie's Public Schools. Then, once that is accomplished, the state will consider the student "career-ready" when you complete one of the following: the **Career/Tech Ed (CTE) Pathway**, the **Alternative Assessment Pathway**, or the **Evidence-Based Pathway**. Each of these options gives the student different possibilities, based on students' interests, to demonstrate that the student is ready for life after high school. They range from a simple acceptance letter from a 4-year college to military enlistment, to a letter guaranteeing full-time employment upon obtaining a high school diploma.

Pathway 3 (this pathway is usually for our CTE cyber students): Pass English 10, Algebra I and Biology. Complete one of the following 3 options:

Obtain an industry-based certification in your CTE program (NOCTI)

Demonstrate high likelihood of success in approved competency assessments (verified by recommendation letter obtained from director of the CTE program)

Demonstrate readiness for continued education in the selected CTE program

Pathway 4: Alternate Assessment. Pass English 10, Algebra I and Biology. Complete one of the following 5 options:

Meet or exceed minimum score on one of the following exams: ACCT=21, ACT Work Keys= GOLD, ASVAB=31, PSAT/NMSQT=970, SAT=1010

Score 3 or higher on an approved AP or IB test

Pass dual enrollment courses in each Keystone subject

Pass a pre-apprentice program

Acceptance into an accredited 4-year nonprofit institution.

Pathway 5: Evidence based Pathway.

Part A: Pass English 10, Algebra I and Biology.

Part B: (Any 3 requirements but must have at least one from each part). Meet or exceed minimum score on one of the following exams: ACT WorkKeys=Silver, SAT subject test+630, Any AP/IB test=3, Successfully complete any dual enrollment course, Obtain an industry recognized credential (OSHA, food safety, CPR), Acceptance to an accredited nonprofit higher education program (community college, tech school, 2 year program)

Part C: Score proficient or advanced on 1 Keystone exam, Complete an approved community service program (minimum of 10 hours), Successfully complete an internship externship, or co-op program, MCAA compliance minimum 2.0 GPA, Letter guaranteeing full time employment after high school. (Minimum of 30 hours a week), Military Enlistment.

Our mission is to help students find a personal path to success. Teachers will review a graduation plan with you that outlines what you must accomplish in order to earn a diploma.


Smart Futures

Smart Futures (<u>www.smartfutures.org</u>) is a K-12 career planning and portfolio platform that helps schools easily implement the Academic Standards for Career Education and Work that are now required by the state of Pennsylvania.

Not long ago, Pennsylvania became the first state in the country to require that all its high school graduates complete a personalized career plan and portfolio tied to K-12 career education benchmarks. These benchmarks, called the Pennsylvania Academic Standards for Career Education and Work (CEW Standards), provide the curriculum road map that assures that all students are prepared for 21st century success.

How does it work? Smart Futures provides a free online platform where students and teachers can work together to find, understand, and meet the expectations of Pennsylvania's standards for Career Education and Work. By navigating through the activities on the Smart Futures website, students can complete the portfolio of work Pennsylvania is looking for from its graduates. Teachers are on hand to help students complete the activities that ultimately reward the student with a portfolio of evidence to show they are armed with the tools commonly necessary for success in the world post-graduation, including a complete resume, cover letter-writing skills, career pathway awareness, and entry level knowledge and skills needed for entering the workforce.

As with most of your Cyber Choice Academy programming, all you'll need is your Chromebook to access the Smart Futures website. You will use Clever to log into your SmartFutures account. From there, your homeroom teachers will guide you through the steps outlined in the site to meet all 23 competencies across all four grade bands.



Expectations - Code of Conduct

As a student of Erie's Public Schools and a member of the Cyber Choice Academy, you have a responsibility to conduct yourself with the same high standards of honesty and integrity as your peers who are in traditional classrooms. In addition to signing off on the policies and consequences outlined in the Erie's Public Schools Student Handbook and Code of Conduct, you must also sign the Cyber Choice Academy agreement as part of your enrollment process. We ask that you review the District's Student Handbook prior to enrolling in the Cyber Choice Academy. The handbook can be found at eriesd.org/handbook.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

All students must enter the building through the metal detectors stationed at the front doors. In addition to the metal detector security measure, you may also be wanded and your personal belongings may be searched at this time. This is not punitive, but rather a safety precaution.

Cellphone policy: Per the Erie's Public School district policy, Students in grades 9 and 10 will have their cellphones collected during class time.

Schoolwide Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (SWPBIS)

The Cyber Choice Academy and all programs located at Emerson-Gridley utilize Positive Behavior Intervention Support, a nationally recognized model used to improve school safety and promote positive behavior. PBIS also helps teachers, students, and staff review data and make informed decisions about expectations and develop appropriate consequences when those expectations are not met. PBIS calls for teachers to deliver lessons about behavior just as they would about any other subject: When students are aware of expectations and understand them, students are better equipped to meet the expectations. Behavior expectations are taught and acknowledged throughout the school year. Our behavior expectations are centered around three main concepts: being respectful, being responsible and being resilient.




