Classroom expectations:

Cell phone policy: It is in your best interest and the interest of your peers that cell phones are away and silent during class. If you are seen with your cell phone during class you will be subject to the following:

- First Violation: Teacher will remind student of the cell phone expectation in the classroom
- **Second Violation**: Teacher will issue a warning remind student that administration will confiscate cell phone if seen a third time
- **Third Violation**: The phone will be confiscated*. The parents/guardians will be notified and the phone will be returned at the end of the day.

After the third *confiscation*, as documented in Infinite Campus, a parent/guardian meeting will be scheduled and the student will be subjected to the continuum of consequences as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.
