Course Description:

In this course, we will learn how to make 2- Dimensional posters and learn that art is all around us and used as a form of visual communication. We will be learning to make basic digital poster compositions using Google Drawings. We will practice lettering techniques and learn effective ways to use typography.

\square Always do your best. Do not copy from your classmates. Your work should be
original. This is Art class. There is absolutely no need to steal someone else's
work and claim it as your own. Doing so will result in an automatic 0.
☐ Put quality ahead of just getting it done. If you take 5 minutes to do an
assignment, it will reflect poorly on your grade. Do not expect quality by rushing
through an assignment just to get it done.
3. Be prepared for class each day. Please bring the following materials to class.
☐ A charged Chromebook. If you do not have one, please get one in the South
Office. You must have one to refer back to missing assignments. Though most of
our work is done on paper, all instructions are posted on Schoology for you to
know what needs to be done for each assignment.
4. Follow directions when given.
☐ When directions are given, do your best to follow them the first time. If you are
confused or have questions, ask.
5. Pay attention, participate, and ask questions.
☐ Engage in what is going on in the classroom. If you have a question, ask it. There
are no stupid questions and, chances are, if you are wondering about it, someone
else in the class is too. Be proactive about your learning and don't be afraid to ask
for help. You are in high school and I should not be behind you to get off your
phones every 5 minutes to do your work.
6. Preserve a positive learning environment.
☐ Student actions that interfere with teaching or learning in the classroom will
